Colomé is one of Argentina's oldest wineries located in the Calchaquí Valley at 2300 metres (7500ft) where extreme conditions create unique terroir. Planted in 1831, the estate vineyard at Colomé is this inspiration for this wine as a tribute to our history and to my father-in-law Donald Hess who came to Colomé with vision, passion and a desire to craft the world's greatest wines.

Aged in both new and used French oak barrels for 18 months, this wine exhibits red fruit and herbal notes typical of our terroir. *Christoph Ehrbar.*
